Summary: NOAH is currently seeking an experienced Conference Coordinator to plan and manage our annual NOAH Conference. The NOAH Conference is a 3.5-day event created for artists, arts administrators, healthcare professionals, designers, educators, students and anyone with an interest in arts in health. The conference is designed to provide opportunities for participants to exchange ideas, gain applicable knowledge, build connections and energize developments for the future of the field. In addition to presentations by individuals in the field the conference also includes pre-conference workshops, keynotes, receptions, awards ceremony and social activities.

The NOAH Conference location changes annually and the Conference Coordinator will work in conjunction with the NOAH Conference Committee Chair(s) and NOAH staff on executing the event. This position works remotely regularly participating in meetings via conference calls as well as Zoom and Skype. In addition, the Conference Coordinator may assist with other NOAH events including but not limited to the Leadership Summit, In-person Board Meetings, and other strategy meetings/events.


2020 Conference Call for Proposals
